



Lutheran Church of Australia. Ms Debbie Venz, LCA Business Manager, introduced and coordinated an engaging presentation by representatives of all departments. The Overseas Mission Department told of people in Cambodia being rescued from poverty and affliction, and being baptised into the Christian faith through the ministry of the Gospel. The comprehensive update on the various courses offered in theology, ethics, education, and training, at Australian Lutheran College reminded us of the wonderful resource we have in this vital institution of the Church. Likewise, information on the growth and development in Lay Ministry (170 people) and its essential role in the ministry of our congregations, made for a very encouraging presentation. We were once again reminded of the significant blessings resulting from the LLL's *Finance with a Mission*, without which we would not be able to achieve as much as we do in ministry. Finke River Mission thanked congregations and individuals for the continuing support for the ministry with approximately 6000 Aboriginal people in Central Australia. It is pleasing to learn of FRM's close working relationship with Lutheran Community Care and the Lutheran schools in Alice Springs

We were encouraged to join *Grow Ministries* in support for the development of resources for ministry with children and youth, such as FaithInk and Faith5.

A report on the activities of ALWS highlighted the positive outcomes from projects supported by Lutherans. In 2013, members of the SA/NT District donated \$1.7million. The presentation by Lutheran Media Ministry updated us regarding the new website, programs on YouTube, podcasts, booklets, worship CDs and live streaming resources for the church.

And finally, the new Lutheran Archives archivist's presentation, introducing us to the tagline *Preserving our Story*. We are urged to make sure we gather and preserve our stories, in order that the church may remain alive for future generations.

Guest Speaker at the Convention Dinner, Dr Graham Buxton, a lecturer at Tabor College, challenged us to reflect on our personal faith journeys. Are we being short sighted in our ministry of the Gospel? Are we too narrowly focused? Do we fail to recognise the ambiguities and mysteries of the Christian faith? Are we too heavily focused on 'doing' rather than 'being'? The incarnation is, after all, a mystery.

We live by faith, not sight. Faith clings to Jesus, who in the mystery of his incarnation, died on the cross and rose again in victory over sin and death. We are by faith, participants and beneficiaries in the death and resurrection of Jesus the Christ.

National Bishop, Pastor John Henderson reiterated the confessional unity which we enjoy as members of the LCA, and the pivotal confession of justification by faith which identifies us as Lutheran. No matter what the season or circumstances of our time, our task of living out the Gospel in our communities remains the same. We are put here to serve, bringing *Love to Life* through faithfulness to our calling as God's people.

The 2014 Budget of \$1,864,000 was adopted by the convention. The expected deficit is \$159,022.

A significant effort has been made to reduce District expenditure over the last Synodical period, sadly resulting in a reduction in support for District ministries and also the LCA. Delegates are encouraged to keep the challenge of supporting the wider church before their congregations.



SA/NT District Popular Report for the 46th Regular Convention (2014)

Theme: Where love comes to life ... AS WE GO AND GROW

AS WE GO AND GROW Mawson Lakes Community Church hosted the convention at Endeavour College. The current pastor is Stephen Trautwein. Being a Community Church, the congregation comprises people from a wide range of Christian denominations, each of them bringing and contributing experiences and insights from other Christian traditions, and also people from non-Christian backgrounds. This creates unique challenges and opportunities for a Lutheran congregation.

The College, with its excellent facilities was an ideal venue. The hospitality provided by the members of Mawson Lakes Community Church, enthusiastically supported by members of the neighbouring congregations and Endeavour College Events Coordinator Mrs Julie Freund, was outstanding. The catering was absolutely superb!

Opening worship was led by Pastor Eugene Minge, with Bishop David Altus preaching. Basing his message on the conference theme, '*Where Love Comes to Life*...AS WE GO AND GROW', Bishop David encouraged us to ponder the question, "*what are we prepared to give up, in order that the Kingdom may grow*?" Love comes to life when we ponder the Cross, where Jesus 'lost' himself in order that the world may be found in Him. As Jesus' people, in losing our 'self' consciousness and entrusting ourselves to Him, we *Live*. Taking to heart "*Love coming to life as we Go and Grow*" therefore, challenges us to prayerfully resolve to be 'losers of self' in order that those about us may become 'winners' with us in Christ.

The Principal of Endeavour College, Ms Heather Vogt, welcomed delegates and distinguished guest Mr Tony Zappia MP, Federal member for Makin.

Ms Vogt, together with the College chaplain, Pastor Dale Gosden, presented the history of Endeavour College which was established in 1998 and now serves 500 students from culturally diverse backgrounds. A video presented the college through the eyes of students.

Pastor Gosden interviewed two people, Nerise and Ryan. Nerise is a current Year 11 student who spoke about the blessings of coming to the school as a Christian active in church life, and being nurtured in the school. Ryan, a 2013 graduate came to the school with no interest in the Christian faith. However, through the ministry of the College has come to faith through, and was baptised on Easter Day 2014. Both students affirmed the value of Lutheran Schools.

Federal member for Makin, Mr Zappia, was most positive in his praise for the life and work of the Lutheran Church, both with respect to the firm foundation of its teaching, and its practical demonstration of the Christian Faith through its people's engagement in the wider community by way of Lutheran Schools, Lutheran Community Care, and Lutheran Aged Care.

Bishop David Altus, in presenting his report, highlighted the importance of caring for our pastors and managing our resources for the sake of the Gospel in changing times. He called on each congregation to talk about its future and consider what sacrifices it may be willing to make for the sake of the whole church, in order to sustain ministry of the Gospel in each

of our regions.

Bishop David spoke about the importance of staying in relationship with each other through effective communication. He thanked the 50% of district congregations which replied to his letter last year seeking feedback on their challenges and concerns. Congregations are asking the question: "What can the District do for us?" He foreshadowed a full review of all District departments later this year, and acknowledged that Synod needs to determine the best way to be good stewards of our District property in North Adelaide.

Bishop David thanked the Assistant Bishops, Pastors Tim Klein and James Winderlich for their support and called the delegates to pray for James as he takes up the role of Principal of Australian Lutheran College.

District Church Council

The following pastors and lay members were declared elected.

Pastor David Altus (District Bishop), Pastor Tim Klein (First Assistant Bishop), Pastor Michael Steicke (Second Assistant Bishop), Mr Mark Schwarz (District Finance Consultant), Pastor Geoffrey Havelberg, Pastor Tom Hoffmann, Pastor Eugene Minge, and Lay Members Mr Craig Hall, Dr Judith Jaensch, Ms Sharyn Mooney, Ms Johanna Pietsch, and Mr Mel Zerner.

Lutheran Community Care Director, Mrs Helen Lockwood, on the theme *Helping Individuals, Families and Communities*, presented us with the stark reality that in SA there are 210,000 people living in poverty, 39,000 of whom are children. LCC is keen to *grow* relationships of service and ministry with schools and congregations. LCC is thankful for the generous support for this ministry of Christian service, and urges congregations to participate, through hosting local events, in *Anti-Poverty Week* (12-18 October), information on which was distributed to delegates.

Aboriginal Ministry SA. The Chair, Pastor Robert Schubert reiterated that the Board is committed to the long term development of Aboriginal leaders in the Church, and is making steady progress in so doing. Pastor Edmund Bilney, who shepherds groups of Aboriginal people within the Adelaide area, shared with us some of the positive developments in this ministry. People interested in SA/NT Aboriginal ministry are encouraged to consider participating in the *Fish 'n' Mission* fun and fellowship tour from 9-15 September.

Mission Department Dr Steen Olsen, Director for Mission, invited us to appreciate the importance of working together to *Grow* the Church through effective local mission. At the heart of such endeavour is to constantly apprehend the radical nature of the good news of the Gospel, and then taking radical steps in passionately sharing it. It means developing a mission culture and approaches which are relevant for the 21st century. It means stepping forward prayerfully in faith, being prepared to let go of some of the old familiar ways, and reskilling ourselves in order that we may better expend ourselves and our resources in meeting the needs and opportunities which God has set before us right now. Dr Steen spoke of the department's involvement in supporting African and Asian ministry, and the planting of new worshipping communities. He announced the secondment of Mr Dean

Eaton to work with the Board on church planting projects and other initiatives. As a result of financial restraints, the position of District Communications Coordinator has been discontinued. Dr Steen thanked Mr Valdis Andersons for the work he has done over the past 5 years in this role, especially his visits to congregations throughout the District. He also thanked Mr Nevin Nitschke for his valuable work in producing resources and leading workshops throughout the District in his role as Mission Facilitator. Nevin has taken up the role of LCA Director for Lay Ministry.

Table Discussion Dr Olsen presented an overview of the LCA Strategic Direction 2013-2018 document, highlighting the first three strategic priorities: 'Grow as God's people', 'Go as God's people' and 'Enable us to Go and Grow'. Delegates participated in table discussion based on the five questions that were discussed in congregations prior to convention. They focused on the common strengths, opportunities and challenges experienced by our congregations.

Children Youth and Family Ministry Director, Ms Fiona Weckert, spoke of the burgeoning success of the *Blueprint Ministries* the department's camp ministry which caters for hundreds of children and young people, with hundreds of young adults volunteering as leaders. These leaders are a significant resource in the Church. Ms Weckert strongly urged congregations to recognise and utilise these young leaders as a valuable resource in their local ministries. She further urged congregations to encourage/sponsor a young person to attend the *EMERGE* leadership Conference at ALC on 17 May. Information on this conference was distributed to delegates.

The Professional Standards Unit Mrs Liz Crawford (LCA) and David Biar (SA/NT) reinforced the message that Professional Standards are for the purpose of preventing harm, and caring for the vulnerable, especially children. (1 Peter 5:1-5)

Lutheran Schools Association Director, Mr John Proeve, cited the testimony of one of the Endeavour College students on the occasion of the opening of convention, as an example of the significant influence Lutheran Schools have on the lives of so many people who have not experienced Christian community prior to attending school. He shared the fact that welcoming students of differing faith backgrounds brings with it the responsibility of not compromising the foundations of our Lutheran faith.

Mr Proeve also informed us that Lutheran Education Australia is celebrating 175 years of Lutheran Education on 5 September 2014. The theme for the celebration is *Yesterday, To-day and Tomorrow*.

Chaplaincy Ministries Director, Dean Eaton, encouraged us to recognize that these ministries flow from the work of the congregation, and the Chair of the Chaplaincy Ministries Council, Mr Danny Perkins, challenged congregations to find ways of being involved. The impact of chaplains in the lives of people outside the close community of the congregation is significant.

Aged Care Council Chair, Mr Matthew Johns, presented information regarding the projected growth in the requirements of care for the aged, and invited people to consider the ministry of caring for the aged as an area of full-time service.
