FRIENDS OF LUTHERAN ARCHIVES — Handing back land to families:

Hermannsburg land titles 1972–1982. Pastor Paul Albrecht was in charge of Finke River Mission at the time government was granting Aborigines in Central Australia freehold titles to their traditional lands. Leaders of five clans around Hermannsburg each wanted their family group to have a separate title, instead of having one collective title that included all five groups. The government eventually agreed to this, and so the original Hermannsburg Mission Lease of almost 3,800 square kms was divided up, and the boundaries between the five clans researched and mapped. Ps Paul Albrecht, Superintendent Garry Stoll and Research Officer Rex Ziersch were three key figures in this unique and complex process. Paul and Garry will tell that story on Sunday 22 August at 2.30 pm at Bethlehem House (upstairs), Sudholz Pl, Adelaide. **Bookings essential.** Please book from Monday 16 to 3 pm on Sat 21 August so we can let you know if there have been any change in COVID restrictions. Vision Christian Media – Murray Bridge Relay Station – Appeal

The MB Inter-Church Council are working with Vision Christian Media to establish a 24 hour repeater radio transmitter in the Murray Bridge area. Vision Christian Media operate 24 hours per day and broadcast from Queensland and via satellite through a low powered repeater we can receive the Christian content in Murray Bridge. This is an opportunity to bless people who for whatever reason are house bound or in care to receive a Christian message at anytime. To set up the radio transmitter a one off cost of \$5000 is needed.

Christ Church Leadership has supports this endeavour as it reaches out to all people in Murray Bridge. Retiring offerings will be taken on Sunday's 8th and 15th August for this very worthwhile project. A minimum of \$700 has been committed by the Leadership team to this appeal. JUST ADD LOVE

"But that's mostly rocks!" I exclaimed as I was shown the building material a new friend was using to construct his family's new clay brick home, with pride and enthusiasm and love. With a knowing smile, he handed me a "rock". As it lay in my hand, I thought, "It feels like a rock; it looks like a rock"....you know the rest. He then instructed, "Add some water from that bucket and work it with your fingers." With a feeling of being "set up", I did as instructed. To my amazement, the "rock" became soft and malleable. Using just my fingers, I could shape and form what had once been hard and unyielding.

Aaah? If only the flintiness, the sharp edges of society could be so easily softened, remoulded into more gentleness, more care, forgiveness, concern? Remoulded, reshaped to build stronger, more lasting relationships that would withstand the disagreement's buffeting winds. Relationships could be gently but firmly fashioned into forms that shielded from the torrents of ridicule and scorn which wear away the features of who we are meant to be. What if I, who can be judgemental, critical, unloving, could be changed? What would it take? Probably a bulldozer and a trench digger.

Then from somewhere in my mind came, "Moreover, I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you; and I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh." Words thousands of years ago, placed into the heart and mind of a man of God, from a God of love. (Ezekial 16:26)

This God of big love sees small acts which demonstrate a new, a remoulded attitude of love in action. A smile for the harassed parent of a toddler in a supermarket aisle. The pause, allowing a bent, older person to cross the road without feeling rushed. Your hand on the shoulder of someone feeling "down". A word that makes someone feel "special".

How do I get this "New Heart"? Look again at what God said. "I will **GIVE** you a new heart". It cannot be bought. It can not be earned. Just as the rock in my hand had to receive the water to be changed; It is only God's great love that can change You and me. It is only His love for us and our acceptance of His love that can mould us into someone whom God can use to bring more love, peace and joy to our friend, to our neighbour, to someone I may not like and who may not like me, and into our community. He also said through His Son Jesus, "My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends." (John 15:12-13) Still not sure? Talk to Him about your questions.
