Saint Paul, a follower of Jesus, got stuck into some people of Corinth for how they were living, like pots with burnt-on grease and grime, and unable to do anything themselves to become sparkly clean and again be right with God. Something like a saucepan I once threw out because I could never get it clean.

However, Paul goes on to say to them, "But you were washed, you were made holy and clean and made friends of God again, you were "made right and valuable in the eyes of a loving God, in the name of (by the sacrifice of) the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God. (1 Corinthians 6:11)

There are some other words related to "washing". Being "washed up". A dictionary describes being "washed up" as "no longer successful, skilful, popular, or needed."

It is a sad fact today that many are affected by community breakdown. People of all ages and social strata are starting to live believing they are "washed-up".
