I've discovered that difficult, because it is more than hearing the words that are

spoken. Listening involves me being attentive; seeking to understand what is being said from the other person's perspective.

Listening involves me being open to what the other person is say: actually wanting to hear opinions.

So a conversation isn't me giving a list of things I want done; and then expecting you to do it. How would you feel if that was the depth of your so called conversation?
