from our Reformation Day celebration with the word 'Change'. What do you think you, through this word is, is answered by 'Change'? Have you changed anything? What might God be wanting us to change, or you personally to change? What is the Spirit saving to you: 'Change!'

Then as I was doing my regular 'SOAP' time with God the word 'Repentance' jumped out at me. 'Repentance' is a change word, and is found throughout God's word. God is often calling people to change, to repent.
