The obvious next step after laving the foundation is what?

In Paul's letter to the believers in Corinth he wrote: "For no one can lay any foundation other than care in giving their the one we already have – Jesus Christ" (1 Cor. 3:11). So the foundation is laid.

Next Paul writes: "Anvone who builds on that foundation may use a variety of

materials - gold, silver, jewels, wood, hay, or straw. But on the judgement day, fire will reveal what kind of work each builder has done" (1 Cor. 3:12,13). The next question is; what might build a am I building on this foundation?
