And they will not need to teach their neighbours, nor will they need to teach their family, saving, 'You should know the LORD.' For everyone, from the least to the greatest. will already know me." (Jer. 31:33,34)

this new covenant

isn't about externals but it changes us from the inside out? We get a changed way of thinking, and a praise to like us. God changed heart, a changed reason for living, our passion comes from the heart. Our passion comes from God's heart: Jesus isn't responding to what we do or don't do. but is living out God's heartfelt passion toward us. Pure and simple, there's no manipulation here. In Jesus, God simply pours out his heart. his motivation flows being, his commitment is rock solid because it is a

living reflection of his God, because we very nature.

In Jesus, do you notice what changes? In Jesus, we get to know God. personally, for who he is, no strings attached.

Thank God the questions is a resounding no. God. in Jesus, is simply acting true to who he is, so that we get to know him for who he
