Had you always thought of the New Covenant as simply coming after the Old Covenant? You've got the old and now you've got the new. I had: but not anymore. I'd totally missed that Jesus ushers in a covenant of newness. I loved that thought, that in Jesus everything is always new, new, new!

The new covenant never gets old; it is the covenant of newness, because in Jesus we get to live with God personally. Every day!

It is always day one of the first month. We're not trapped in the past. We're not stuck on some path

of performance, always seeking to prove ourselves. always seeking to arrive, but never arriving.

We live in the new dav. everydav. when we live with Jesus. For when the Messiah comes everything becomes new: for we are dwelling with him, abiding in his presence, living in the intimacy of his love for us. And that never gets old.

Have you noticed how being loved never gets old? How being valued and wanted never gets old? How feeling delighted in never gets old?

The power of the Messiah's presence is to make everything new. When we receive his presence

everything becomes new. Which would be totally impossible if the Messiah had not made himself present with us: if the Messiah hadn't come new every morning. to dwell with us. to tabernacle with us, with you.

In the Old Testament the symbol of God's presence was the tent of meeting called the tabernacle. That's where the Ark of the Covenant was, with the two stone tablets Moses had received from God. That's where the cloud of God's presence hovered over. God was present with his people; but not personally. The Messiah was vet to come.

In Jesus, the Messiah has been born, one with us. Born our brother, that mistakes, missed we might share life with him; that we might tabernacle with him. That old phrase indicates that Jesus has come to walk

and talk with us through the whole of life in a wonderful intimacy.

An intimacy which is What an amazing relationship of love and affection Jesus has created for us to live in and enjoy each and every day.

In the Messiah **Every Day New** 

Whenever we receive love for me is new. Jesus' presence, everything becomes new. So we are the people of the second chance: for in Jesus. God's love for us comes anew everyday.

Wouldn't it be horrid to think we were trapped in vesterday's failures. opportunities? I seem to have this wonderful ability to make mistakes, to miss opportunities, to fail: what about you?

Without Jesus being real, being present, being there for me, for you, what hope would I have? I'd be left with my failures seeking to rule my life, my mistakes dominating me, my missed opportunities eating away at my conscience. That almost sounds hellish!

Instead I live with Jesus, who makes mv dav new, every day. - Why, because his every day. That's the nature of relationships: and that is what Jesus has created for us to live in. A relationship of love and affection: a conversational

So how do we receive the Messiah's presence, that we might live with him daily in that wonderful new life he brings?

If Jesus is symbolically born on the first day of the first month; the first day of Nissan, symbolising a new day, ushering in a new year. I think it fair to presume that Jesus wants to live this new life with us. Why else would he with us? Why else would Jesus have come personally, if it wasn't to share a personal. intimate relationship?

And the way you share a personal relationship revolves around sharing your thoughts and dreams of faith is prayer; with the other person. talking to Jesus, Allowing the other person to see into you; that's intimacy. And there is no place isn't interested in we keep more secret being a theory; he that our hurts and pains, our failures.

I think that's why Jesus invites us to share with him those hurts and pains. To share our failures with him; which is to

allow him in. That is to allow Jesus to dwell with us: opening the door to him, you could say.

What a wonderful new day that ushers in; fear, regret, disappointment, rage are replaced by Jesus and the love he brings, the have been born, one forgiveness he offers, do it right. That's not
