everything, following his lead, grabbing what he places on your heart, boldly stepping out doing it.

Then Jesus will get to out in faith doing celebrate a life lived by faith in him; a life lived intimately, personally with him. Then we'll continue that celebration of life everyone here today with Jesus living in his love and affection.

Today I invite you to give up arguing and quarrelling over disputable matters; like hymns verses songs, liturgy verses no liturgy, gowns verses no gowns, Holdens verses Fords, give up arguing and quarrelling.

Let's all seek to encourage each other to be living by faith in Jesus, Let's

all passionately seek to support the other person to live by their Jesus conscience. Encourage them to risk boldly stepping what they feel Jesus has placed on their heart.

I encourage to regularly stop and talk with Jesus about your life choices; no matter how big or small. Invite Jesus to lead, to prompt, to inspire, to convict, to lead your shopping.

That's why we have that wonderful gift called prayer; so we can talk with Jesus. so we can be in conversation with Jesus, and then

boldly step out living

I talked with Jesus and felt this desire to visit, I got an image of a Nissan, I had the smell of a roast and an image of a table set for guests. I talked with Jesus, he responded, I grabbed that first thought, and went with it, talked it over with him, sought to live by faith: trusting Jesus, risking everything in him.

Jesus I pray that you place on each of our hearts vour conviction so that we might live boldly for you, with you, risking everything in you.

I think this is a delicious reading. I love the way Paul leads us in settling what is a disputable matter.

We're not encouraged to try and win. Paul presents a way of dealing with things without quarrelling. Importantly without quarrelling over, 'disputable matters'.

There are plenty of matters that Jesus makes clear cut. When you look at the weak and who's story of Joseph it is clear cut, you don't throw you brother into a well and later sell him as a slave and then lie about it to your father. That's not a disputable matter.

There are disputable matters. Paul uses the example of eating my way of thinking. meat or not. For

many of Paul's era this was more than just eating meat, it was about eating meat sacrificed to an idol. By eating that meat were they worshipping an idol? This was no little matter.

LIVE BY FAITH

Romans 14:1-12

Paul writes; "Accept the one whose faith is weak, without quarrelling over disputable matters." Notice, that puts the onus on you. It isn't meant to bring up a debate about who's strong. No, if you think you're right, you're taking the position of the strong. Quarrelling over So you are invited to accept the person you consider wrong, in other words has a weak faith.

I'm not encouraged to argue them into I'm not told to make

then agree with me. That's what I am tempted to do, argue my point, till I win. I'm tempted to dominate the other person.

That reminds me of these words of Jesus: "You know that the rulers in this world lord it over their people, and officials flaunt their authority over those under them. But among you it will be different. Whoever wants to be a leader among you must be your servant." (Matt. 20:25; Mk 10:43, Lk 22:25,26)

What are we being lead to do?

Paul writes: "Each of them should be fully convinced in their own mind. Whoever regards one day as special does so to the Lord. Whoever eats meat does so to the Lord, for they give thanks to God: and whoever abstains does so to the Lord and gives thanks to God." (Rom. 14:5,6)

This is a call to live by faith. I am being lead to grow people that they live by faith. That is their action is a result of their trust in Jesus.

One person doesn't eat meat sacrificed to importantly Jesus will idols because to do so would for them be who trust him, who a denial of Jesus. It is risk following his lead Father. an act of faith: faith in in their lives. Jesus. The other

person eats meat thanking Jesus, knowing it's only meat and they aren't worshipping anything other than Jesus, the creator of meat. It is an act of faith.

'Disputable Matters'

After teaching on prayer Jesus finishes with these words: "when the Son of Man returns, how many will he find on the earth who have faith?" (Lk 18:8)

Notice Jesus isn't going to ask how many arguments I won. How often I got my way, because I was right. No. be looking for people

When I pray, that's what I'm after. I'm after Jesus guiding my life, because I want to follow him. I seek to risk everything on Jesus. trusting him.

I love hearing this passage from Paul; it leads me away from arguing. It leads me to help you take a

risk in hearing Jesus, trusting his lead, and then boldly doing it. Why? Because vou believe that's where Jesus is calling you.

An important reminder: this is talking about disputable matters. If vou feel lead to worship money, making your life's goal to be rich, clearly that isn't Jesus, Idolatry, no matter the form, isn't a disputable matter, it clearly isn't walking in step with Jesus. He worships Father, and only his heavenly

But there are so many areas in life that are disputable. like what computer to privilege to debate buy, what car to buy ,when's the best time to take a holiday, should we only use the organ for worship, we have a designated church building.

Life is full of disputable matters. For those leaving high school, what will you do next year. Jesus invites vou to talk with him about letter to the Premier. it, to share from your or to peacefully heart, to listen to his heart, to grab what he places on your heart, then do it.

Following the laws of the land, even the ones you think, know faith. are stupid, isn't a disputable matter. We are clearly told to Paul's words for me obev the laws of the land, except when we convinced". In other are told not to follow Jesus. Then we follow Jesus: his clear words.
